

HCSC LINEN SERVICES

Reliable and responsive linen service is essential for providing quality patient care. HCSC is an industry leader in healthcare textile rental services, and has earned brand credibility for excellence and trustworthiness. HCSC consults and collaborates with its owners and customers to create custom linen service solutions that deliver value and evolve with their needs.

Hospitals, ambulatory care facilities, physician offices, surgery centers, and long-term care organizations view HCSC as a dependable, professional partner that they can count on, particularly in times of crisis. The COVID-19 pandemic highlighted the importance of this need. HCSC's reputation for quality and customer service was rewarded as several new health systems converted their linen programs in the past year including Penn State Lancaster Medical Center, Cape Regional Health System, Temple University Health System, and Beebe Medical Center.

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HCSC's Ambulatory Care division continued to expand its service area, as three of its service routes were shifted to operate out of the renovated Baltimore, Maryland plant. The division now serves more than 2,200 locations on 21 routes, with more than 2,400 deliveries per week. In addition, 20 ambulatory care accounts signed on to use HCSC's new full-service curtain cleaning program that also includes removal and installation services. Beginning with the new fiscal year, HCSC plans to market, expand and grow the Ambulatory Care business in Delaware and Maryland by utilizing the new Baltimore hub.

While HCSC experienced a significant 12% increase in its linen expenses during the past year, there were no supply disruptions nor reported quality concerns with the products from the customer base. HCSC staff were able to secure supplier contracts for the calendar year, including a price hold for plastics. All plants continued to focus on sustainability efforts, including recycling more than 728,000 pounds of plastic, cardboard, and paper.

Although inflation has eased, cost increases continued to impact operations, particularly in diesel fuel, utilities, and linen costs. While water costs rose 10%,

overall consumption decreased 5% from the prior year. Natural gas and diesel fuel costs rose by 9% and 17% respectively, while total miles driven decreased by 6%, which was achieved through efficiencies in distribution practices.

Hiring and retention of employees at the five laundry processing facilities continued to improve throughout the year with few exceptions. Payroll costs remained stable, with increases in plant productivity, resulting in reduced overtime. Additionally, labor relations remained healthy - a testament to the positive relationship shared among the production team, management staff, and labor unions.

As the fiscal year progressed, HCSC's Linen Services and Finance teams continued to focus on the implementation of the *Linen Master* shipping and billing system. In addition, after successfully managing the start-up of HCSC's Ambulatory Care operations at the Baltimore plant, a new wrap machine was installed at the Ambulatory Care site in Allentown.

Over the past year, HCSC continued conducting semi-annual customer experience surveys, and held quarterly business reviews with several larger systems within its customer network. These client feedback activities have provided HCSC and its customers with valuable insights on its strengths, as well as actionable areas for improvement.

HCSC LINEN SERVICES (CONTINUED)

Several important investments were made in the Allentown plant this past year. The exterior received a needed facelift with new paint, signage, LED lighting, and landscaping. In addition, a new UV system was installed on a trial basis that treats and enhances the oxidation process, increases stain removal and whiteness, and, most importantly, virtually eliminates organic contaminants. RFID tracking equipment was also installed in Allentown, while staff continues to evaluate scrub suit dispensing equipment options.

Hospital Central Services Mission: Partnering together to enhance the patient experience.

Recognizing HCSC's ultimate mission to enhance the patient experience, several product improvements were implemented to increase member hospitals' ease of use and product satisfaction. In addition to rolling out the full-service, customer-owned privacy curtain program, patient safety product enhancements included the introduction of the PerforMAX fitted sheets, blankets, and pillowcases. Knit contour sheets were

increased to a length of 86", to fit on both Hill-Rom Centrella and Striker ICU hospital beds, and the length of bed sheets was increased to 112". Additionally, a heavier fabric was introduced for patient and TIV gowns. Behavioral Health scrub suits and pediatric products were added, and surgical towels were upgraded with a tighter weave and heavier fiber for less linting. Staff also increased the testing of new products to ensure that all required specifications are maintained.

HCSC's commitment to providing its customers with safe, reliable, high-quality linen products and services includes following the strict industry certification standards of the Healthcare Laundry Accreditation Council (HLAC) and Textile Rental Services Association (TRSA) "Hygienically Clean" programs. The Kingston, Pennsylvania and Baltimore, Maryland plants are both certified through 2024; and the Asbury Park, New Jersey plant through 2025. The Camden, New Jersey and Allentown, Pennsylvania plants are dual-certified by HLAC and TRSA through 2025. This recertification ensures that HCSC's clients will receive a timely flow of products that are consistently safe for both their employees and patients.

MILLER-KEYSTONE BLOOD CENTER



Miller-Keystone Blood Center serves as a blood provider for 35 hospitals in eastern Pennsylvania and western New Jersey. For more than 50 years, MKBC has been one of the nation's most highly regarded blood centers, delivering safe, reliable blood products to meet the needs of hospital partners in the community.

This past year, the Blood Center took several steps to continue to bolster the blood supply through investments and programs to engage new and existing blood donors. MKBC relocated its Easton Donor Center to a larger space in Palmer Township that is more convenient and visible to area residents. A soft opening was held in March, followed by a grand opening celebration and ribbon cutting in April with VIPs including Northampton County Executive Lamont McClure, and representatives from the offices of the honorable Lisa Boscola, Joseph Emrick, and Susan Wild attending.

MKBC also launched the "Drops" recruitment initiative, a monthly program designed for businesses to partner with the Blood Center to increase blood donations from their employee base. Partnering organizations receive customized monthly content designed to educate, inform, and inspire employees to donate blood at their organization's blood drives or at an MKBC donor center. It includes general information on the importance of donating blood, donor eligibility information, MKBC Donor Center locations, upcoming Blood Center events/promotions, and more. Partnering organizations share this information with their employees and encourage them to schedule appointments.

In February, MKBC launched a program to educate the Hispanic Community about the importance of diversifying the community blood supply for better patient outcomes. A Community Liaison Manager was hired that was made possible by a two-year grant from the Highmark Foundation. This individual began focusing on developing strong community partnerships with Hispanic businesses, churches, schools, and organizations to boost MKBC's donor base through education and outreach.

In addition to supporting the local hospitals with life-saving blood each day, MKBC also supports a network of community blood centers to prepare for and respond to unforeseen emergencies. This year, the Blood Center joined the Blood Emergency Readiness Corp, or BERC, a network of blood centers across the nation committed to responding to any mass transfusion disasters that may strike. Blood Centers in the group are "on-call" on a rotating basis to respond to a BERC activation. In May of 2022, during its first on-call time frame, MKBC was called into action to supply emergency blood products to healthcare facilities in Texas following the Uvalde Elementary School shooting.

The Blood Center also announced an alliance with BioLinked®, an organization that partners with trusted Blood Centers throughout the U.S. to build a robust network of diverse individuals interested in participating in clinical research studies. Donors can register with BioLinked® regardless of their blood donor status, and involvement is optional, confidential, and self-managed. The database allows BioLinked® to anonymously search for willing individuals who meet specific research needs. This is yet another way for the Blood Center, its donors, and all community members to help find cures and save more lives!

In April, MKBC staff participated in the first annual “Blood Advocacy Week,” a virtual initiative that focused on collaboration among the blood bank community, legislators, agency decision makers, providers, advocates, and others. Highlights of the week included presentations on trends impacting the nation’s blood supply, promoting new donor eligibility criteria, and why donor diversity is critical for the nation’s blood supply.

Blood Advocacy Week was created to allow individuals and organizations to participate, raise their collective voices, and make clear that everyone is impacted by the lifesaving power of blood donation. Goals included promoting the value of blood to patients, communities, and the healthcare system; and advocating for changes that strengthen the blood supply and ensure blood is available when needed most. Several local and state representatives supported the awareness effort through media mentions and/or social media posts to encourage blood donations.

The Blood Center continues to prepare for implementing the FDA’s new guidance on individual risk assessment, including significant changes to donor history questionnaires, standard operating practices, and more. This initiative will help create a more inclusive blood donation process and increase the availability of blood products for our region and the country, while still maintaining the safety of the blood supply. A final implementation date will be announced in the new fiscal year.

The FDA also revised many of its eligibility guidelines for travel and lifted the final section of its variant Creutzfeldt-Jakob disease (vCJD), or “mad cow,” ban for persons who previously lived in the United Kingdom, France, and/or Ireland.

MKBC continued to honor the nation’s veterans through its Veterans Still Serving (VSS) program. Veterans embody selflessness and service to their communities and the nation. Throughout the year, blood donors who are also military veterans received a customized MKBC Challenge Coin, symbolizing camaraderie and unity, and honoring their sustained contributions to their communities. More than 300 of these challenge coins have been presented since the beginning of the program in 2022. MKBC continues to recognize these veterans and acknowledge their impact, as photos of each receiving their challenge coin rotate on the OptiSigns in donor center canteens.



MKBC’s “Thank the Donor[®]” program, enables transfusion recipients to anonymously connect with their donors to thank them for their generosity. These recipients’ words sincerely reflect MKBC’s lifesaving impact on the communities that we serve.

“One year ago today, I delivered our third child - a son. I also almost lost my life to a hemorrhage just hours after the birth. Because of you, I am here to celebrate my son’s first birthday with my family. Because of you, today remained a day of joy, and not one of sorrow. Words will never be enough, but thank you. You literally helped save my life.”

“Thank you so much for your willingness to donate blood! My dad needed platelets before he could undergo an emergency procedure, so I don’t know what would have happened had he not been able to get a transfusion. Your donation is so generous and went to very good use!”

“I recently had a terrible scare. My blood level had dropped so low that I was scared I wouldn’t be able to recover. Due to your kind generosity, I SURVIVED!!! I thank you, and my family thanks you as well. I am a wife of over 30 years, a mom of 3 children, a Mimi to 1 grandchild, and I also care for my elderly mom. You will never know what this has meant to my entire circle. I thank you from the bottom of my heart.”

“I really am grateful for your time and effort to donate blood. I am an ovarian cancer patient who has been receiving chemo since August of 2021. The chemo is really affecting my hemoglobin. I am now at the point that I need blood transfusions. Your generous gift of blood will help me regain some of my lost energy to continue my fight. Prayers for remission. And again, thank you very much.”

MILLER-KEYSTONE BLOOD CENTER (CONTINUED)

A moving tribute to 9/11 heroes marked the start of the fiscal year, as MKBC welcomed the Tunnel to Towers Foundation 9/11 Never Forget Mobile Exhibit to its Pittston and Bethlehem locations. More than 60 sponsors joined together for this special tribute. A total of 448 blood units were collected, which far surpassed the original goal to collect 343 units of blood. The 343-unit goal represented one unit for each fire, police, and/or EMS worker who lost their lives at the World Trade Center on September 11th.

Fundraising initiatives, including the Fall Annual Appeal and the newly created Corporate Sponsorship program, raised nearly \$300,000 for The MKBC Fund, enabling the purchase of life-saving testing and collection equipment as well as blood mobile and courier vehicles. Total fundraising for the fiscal year neared \$600,000 and included efforts to secure grants from regional foundations.

In June, Miller-Keystone Blood Center honored 115 volunteers who work tirelessly with MKBC staff each and every day. Several weeks after the event, we sadly said goodbye to Jean Achey, a dedicated volunteer to MKBC and numerous other organizations throughout the Lehigh Valley. Jean passed away at age 94, after having volunteered more than 20,000 hours at MKBC, spanning more than 30 years. Jean has left a legacy of service that will be long remembered and an inspiration to all.
